Notes on the above schedule:

- All classes (except College Success Skills, which is already full and World/US History – see below) are open to any GECS student, providing there is room in the class. Classes held at the high school program (all classes except math) will be limited to 10 students per class. A few of the elective classes may be able to accommodate more than 10 students; we will do so if we can maintain the quality of the class.
- Priority for enrollment in classes at the high school program will be given to students in the Early College High School Program.
- The woodworking class is tentative, we're still working out details to see if we can make it work. In any case, that class will most likely be full.
- SST/Foreign Language/VAPA rotating elective: SST stands for silent study time. This will be the new incarnation of our silent reading, and will go from 10-10:30. The foreign language will mostly be Rosetta Stone in the computer lab, unless we have enough students interested in the same language to organize a class. The VAPA rotating elective will change each learning period and will include some drama/improv, some art, maybe crafts and jewelry making, possibly poetry or creative writing, perhaps making soaps, lotions, or bath salts – basically an artsy-craftsy-creative grab-bag based on student interest.
