

College OPTIONS Transfer Scholarship Application



Funding for this scholarship is made possible by the College Access Foundation of California.

What is the College OPTIONS Transfer Scholarship?

Through a grant from the College Access Foundation, College OPTIONS is reaching out to Shasta and Siskiyou County first-generation, income-eligible students who choose to start at Shasta College or College of the Siskiyous, are ready to take college-level classes and are focused about their transfer goals. Our scholarship will provide the following award:

- \$1,000 for freshman year at community college (Shasta or College of the Siskiyous)
- \$1,000 for sophomore year at community college (Shasta or College of the Siskiyous)
- \$5,000 for junior year at a four-year, regionally accredited college or university
- \$5,000 for senior year at a four-year, regionally accredited college or university

In addition to the monetary award (a total of \$12,000), our scholarship coordinator will be in frequent contact with you throughout your entire college career to make sure that you are successful in meeting your academic goals.

Who is eligible to apply for this scholarship?

If you can check EVERY box below, we encourage you to submit an application:

- Your entire senior year in high school (2009-10) was in Shasta or Siskiyou County and you will graduate with a high school diploma or GED
- You are a U.S. Citizen or a permanent resident
- You are a 1st generation college student (neither of your parents completed a 4 year, Bachelor's Degree)
- Your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) as determined by the 2010-11 FAFSA is \$4,500 or less
- You will attend Shasta College or College of the Siskiyous as a full-time, first-time freshman in Fall 2010
- Your academic cumulative GPA in high school was a 2.0 GPA or better
- You will be ready to take *college level* coursework at the community college as demonstrated by the results of your community college assessment tests
 - English: you must place into English 1A or higher
 - Math: you must place into a college-level, transferrable math course
- You plan to transfer to a four-year institution after two years at community college. To do this, you must:
 - Have well-defined major/career goals OR be willing to spend the time required in your first semester to develop your major/career goals, *and*
 - Complete an *average* of 15 units per semester to have the required 60 units for transfer

How are students selected for this scholarship?

Community members will review submitted applications. Finalists will be selected for an interview in early June. If you are selected for an interview you will be notified in late May. From the interviews, a total of ten students from the two counties will be selected as recipients for 2010-11.

How do I apply for the College OPTIONS Transfer Scholarship?

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Before submitting this application, please make sure you that you meet the eligibility criteria as stated on the page 1. If you do not meet ALL the criteria, you are not eligible for this scholarship.

Your application packet must include the following documents:

- The completed application form (pages 3 and 4 of this application)
- Copy of high school transcript; unofficial transcript is fine
Notice to homeschooled students: if your school does not provide transcripts, please provide a short statement describing your studies, copies of any test scores available (SAT, ACT, CHSPE, etc) and the name and phone number of your school contact
- Copy of transcripts from any other schools (community college coursework taken while in high school, online courses, etc); unofficial transcript is fine
- Copy of Shasta College or College of the Siskiyous math and English assessment test results
- Copy of the **complete, multi-page** SAR (Student Aid Report) you received after submitting your 2010-11 FAFSA; must show EFC (Expected Family Contribution) to be \$4,500 or less
- Short statements addressing the following topics (type answers on a separate sheet):

What is your intended major or career goal? Discuss how your interest in the major/career developed and how you have researched this major/career. If applicable, describe any experience you have had that could be connected to your major or career — such as volunteer work, internships and employment, participation in student organizations and activities — and what you have gained from your involvement.

Personal information (300 words):

Tell us about a time in high school that was a challenge for you (can be personal or academic). *Briefly* describe the situation, but devote most of your essay to a discussion of how you addressed the situation and what resources you used to help yourself.

All application materials must be submitted together by mail or hand-delivered to the College OPTIONS Center in Redding and **must be received in the center by 5:00 pm, Friday, May 7, 2010.**

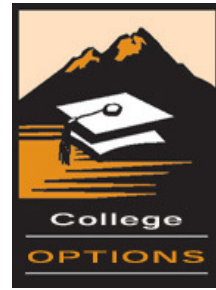
